From our inception 50 years ago, Totino-Grace High School has embraced the model of Christ, our Church, and our founders' charisms by purposefully creating a welcoming environment rooted in respect and love. Over the past twenty years alone, Eagle athletic teams have won 120 conference championships, 59 section championships and 26 state championships. #### **FOOTBALL**

The 2016 Eagles concluded an outstanding season in the final game of the Class 6A State Football Tournament on November 25 at U.S. Bank Stadium. Totino-Grace went head-to-head with the Eden Prairie Eagles and were victorious with a 28-20 win.

#### **BOWLING**

The Totino-Grace varsity bowling team won the section championship for the second year in a row and competed in the 24 team Minnesota State High School Bowling Tournament on December 3 at Memory Lanes in Minneapolis.

#### **DECA**

On January 29 and 30, 21 Totino-Grace DECA students competed in the District 4 Competition. They participated in a range of career and business related events against 13 other schools in the area with over 650 total student participants. Nine TG students qualified for the state competition.





#### **SCIENCE CLUB**



#### **WRESTLING**

Following conference and section wins, the Eagle wrestling team competed in the 2017 State Wrestling Team Tournament on March 2 at the Xcel Energy Center. Six Totino-Grace wrestlers qualified to compete in the Individual State Wrestling Tournament with Jared Florell '17 placing first at 182 pounds and Jake Svihel '19 placing second at 113 pounds.

#### **DRUMLINE**

The Totino-Grace drumline placed second at the Minnesota State Percussion Championship on April 8 at the Mayo Civic Center. They were behind the first place winners by less than one point!

#### **BOYS TRACK AND FIELD**

On May 10, the TG boys track and field team qualified for the True Team State Meet by winning the 4AA Section Meet. They competed in the True Team State Championship Meet on May 20 with an eighth place finish.

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#### Mission, Faith, and Service

#### STUDENT GROUPS DRIVE SUPPORT

Totino-Grace student groups and teams coordinated a number of support initiatives this year. From Tackle Cancer fundraisers to food drives, the annual Dodge for a Difference event to school supply collections, our students joined together to promote the needs in our local and global community and provide opportunities for students and staff to learn about various non-profit organizations and the people they serve.

#### **MISSION TRIPS**

Totino-Grace High School's mission trip program encompasses the core values of the Lasallian mission while providing students with unique opportunities to learn about different cultures and poverty issues locally and internationally. In the 2016-2017 school year, Campus Ministry coordinated 14 mission trips locally and across the country with 150 Totino-Grace student participants.

#### LASALLIAN YOUTH SERVICE

Lasallian Youth service opportunities are offered after school daily and provide meaningful opportunities for students to live out their faith through service. One of our service sites is Sharing and Caring Hands. More than 160 of our current students (25% of the student body) have served over 800 non-required service hours at the site this year alone! Mr. Mike Shimek, religion teacher, has been taking students there every Tuesday for nearly 25 years!







## **Educational Enrichment Opportunities**

Totino-Grace students participated in unique opportunities to enhance their classroom learning. Engineering Institute students had a learning and exploration day at Medtronic Operational Headquarters. The TG marketing class met with their mentors at General Mills. Journalism students attended a program at the State Capitol. SOURCE students attended the Missing Voices Conference at St. Mary's University. These examples are just a few of the outstanding experiences Totino-Grace offers students to expand on classroom learning through educational enrichment.

First Days: 50 years Later







## Foundation Builder

#### **Bob Betzold - Class of 1973**

As a high school athlete, Bob had a knack for running. He was a four-year member of the track team and ran on the cross country team during his junior and senior years. In addition, he played intramural touch football and basketball. After high school, Bob started playing soccer. At the time, it was a relatively new sport in the U.S. He comments, "The exercise was similar to long-distance running, but it was more fun."

Bob enjoyed being taught by legendary teachers Mr. Frank Preese,

Mr. Dave Nigon, Mr. Bud Paape and Mr. Ned Thompson. He shares, "Ned Thompson would not teach us calculus. He wanted us to master all of the basics, leading up to calculus; to be able to look at an equation and visualize what it looked like graphically. He was right. In college, there were kids who bragged about already having calculus in high school. I did better than they did. Thank you, Ned! He also taught my son, David, who graduated in 2005. That was special for both of us to have the same high school math teacher."





If you have attended an athletic event in the past five decades, you were likely to see Bob in the stands. He explains, "Back in the 70s, we were a basketball school and I went to all the home games. After I graduated,

I continued attending games. It gave me a break from college homework, and was something I preferred doing rather than going to parties or bars. I thought that someday I'd outgrow it. Instead, I turned into a high school sports junkie with TG being my number one team. When my wife, Peg, and I were looking for a house in the mid-80s, we found the perfect one which had a back yard that abuts the old dust bowl -- TG's current practice fields. I could just walk over to home games. Later, my support expanded to girls basketball and volleyball. Now TG is well-known for football, so I'm obviously a fan of that amazing program."

Bob's dedication is not limited to sports at Totino-Grace. "My son got into show choir which I enjoy even more than high school sports. Now I'm a high school show choir junkie. I go to most of the competitions, many of which are in other states, and try to see as many performances as possible. I volunteer every year at Spectacular. It's my favorite volunteer activity of the year."

"There have been so many exciting TG football games, too many to list here, but it's the show choir success that has made a name for TG across the country. Still, all of these successes mean nothing compared to what goes on in the classroom -- the discipline and moral standards that are taught." Bob adds, "I'm so fortunate that my parents sent me and my siblings to Catholic schools. I was not a top student by any means, but Grace gave me the tools to succeed in college, get a degree in electrical engineering from the University of Minnesota, and to have my dream career as an engineer (spending eight years at Honeywell and more than 32 years at Medtronic). It also gave me a moral compass and strengthened my Catholic faith, which has guided me along the way. Without a doubt, I would not be where I am today if it were not for my four years at Grace. I'm also grateful for the education my son, David, got at TG. He followed my career path, but was a much better student than I was, earning an undergraduate degree from Marquette and a masters degree from Northwestern, both in electrical engineering.

While the cost of tuition can be a barrier for some families, Bob's dedication to the school, and empathy for those who need financial aid, drive his financial support. "When I was young, I tinkered with electronics and knew that I wanted to be an electrical engineer. Back in the day, there was no open enrollment for public schools. I lived in North Minneapolis and would have gone to Patrick Henry. Had I gone there, I never would have acquired my engineering degree. I have empathy for the kids who cannot attend because of the cost. That's why I'm committed to donating annually to the Lasallian Mentor Scholarship Fund, supporting the financial aid program at TG."

**Hope Schiller** and the Concordia University Golden Bears took the Division II National Volleyball Championship title in December of 2016.


