From the President's Desk

This year marks the 50th anniversary year of Totino-Grace High School's first graduating class in 1970. Initially known as Archbishop Grace High School, the school cost \$2.2 million to build; tuition was about \$300 per year. Grace High School opened with six School Sisters of Notre Dame and four Christian Brothers. At one point, these numbers eventually grew to as many as 18 Sisters and 11 Brothers living on campus.

In 1980, the name of our school was augmented to Totino-Grace High School to honor generous benefactors Jim and Rose Totino, entrepreneurs in the frozen pizza business. At the time, Jim and Rose's gift of \$1 million was the largest ever given to a Catholic high school in the nation. Their profound commitment to Catholic education funded facility expansion and established the school's endowment, which remains the foundation of our student tuition assistance program.

In 1997, Totino-Grace's long association with the Christian Brothers and its support of the Lasallian educational mission led Totino-Grace to declare itself a Lasallian school. Totino-Grace continues to be part of a worldwide network of over 975 Lasallian schools across 80 nations. Lasallian educators are inspired and motivated by the meaning behind Saint John Baptist de La Salle's quote, "To touch the hearts of your students is the greatest miracle you can perform."

From the beginning, the Brothers and Sisters welcomed the presence of lay teachers and staff as their colleagues in every area of school operations. Most of the teachers were very young, many just a few years older than their students. The early days were about establishing an identity and building a school community. Our teachers liked their jobs, they liked each other, and they loved their students. This first class of students and staff members started a legacy of confidence, hope, and promise that endures today:

- A sense that every student matters;
- A sense that every student will be known, challenged, and supported;
- A sense that a rigorous education is key to a good life;
- A sense that investing in and serving others is incumbent on us as members of the human community;
- A sense that God has a purpose for each of us.

The Lasallian expression "Together and by Association" describes a promise to make a difference in young people's lives through relationships and education, and that is what generations of faculty, staff, alumni, parents, and friends have accomplished. Totino-Grace has been blessed with a community dedicated to giving back through time, talent, and treasure. The common desire is for future Eagles to also enjoy the same sense of belonging, academic preparation, personal challenge, and faith development our school has long been known for. On behalf of the Totino-Grace school community, I am grateful for this enduring community-wide philanthropic support.

In this edition of *The Continuum*, we kick off the yearlong celebration of our first class of graduates. Much has changed in the 50 years since they received their diploma, but this class — and the educators and leaders who were with them every step of the way — carved the path for decades of proud Eagle alumni who celebrate the same traditions and educational mission today.

Live Jesus in our hearts. Forever!


In the late 1950s, the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis sought to expand the number of Catholic high schools in the Twin Cities. Land was purchased in Fridley for a new high school to serve Catholic families in the surrounding area.



In 1965, the Archdiocese invited the Christian Brothers and the School Sisters of Notre Dame to join together to oversee the administration of the new school. Named in honor of Archbishop Thomas L. Grace, an early Minnesota bishop who was a pioneer in education, Archbishop Grace High School opened in September 1966 with 175 freshmen. For each of the next three years, another class of students was added.

Being a member of the first graduating class afforded students with a high school experience that could never be replicated. These students were the first to walk each corridor and learn in each classroom. They established teams and clubs and created traditions that are still enjoyed today. The relationship between members of the class of 1970 and staff was unique; they grew together over the course of four years. In the classroom and beyond, our first Eagles made lasting friendships, enriched their faith, and became lifelong learners. They established the path for future Eagles to succeed.

As the class of 1970 approaches the 50 year mark since they left campus with a diploma in hand, several graduates reflect on their time in high school and the people and events that had a lasting impact.



MICHAEL HEIGES

I think the most important thing to remember about the first years at Grace was that everything was experimental, and although the Brothers and the Sisters had teaching experience, they had never worked in a co-ed environment. In our freshman year the school was still under construction and all classes were held in corridor two.

After freshman year we had our first influx of young lay teachers. This infusion of young blood had a significant impact on the energy of the school. In this group of faculty there were many outstanding teachers.

If you talk with any of the boys in the class of 1970 they will tell you one story about community building in our class. During the first three months of the school year during physical education class we picked up rocks from what are now the baseball and football fields. That's right, no volleyball, basketball or presidential fitness competitions; we simply picked up rocks under the supervision of Brother Dominick Kennedy who said that it was good for our souls. At the time there were no outdoor athletic fields and we moved thousands of rocks in order to get them ready for seed and water. In retrospect it is hilarious, at the time not so much.

The singular distinguishing characteristic of our class is that we were seniors for all four years of high school. We never had a class showing us the ropes or beating us down (some faculty thought that was a problem). It allowed us to grow into responsible roles much more quickly than would have been possible if there were classes ahead of us.

Mike Heiges was one of three 1970 graduates to return to Grace in a teaching role.

I taught from fall of 1974 through spring of 1978. I think I always wanted to teach and being able to teach at Grace was an honor and a pleasure. By the time I arrived back at the school there were a number of new faculty members that I thought were great additions. I thought that there was a great balance of committed long term faculty and new people. One of the things I liked best was that I was joined on the staff by Mike O'Connell who also graduated in the class of '70 and went to St Mary's. We had stories from the past that not everyone knew. Perhaps the most enjoyable aspect was getting involved in the cross country program and spending time with some of the most dedicated athletes in the school.

There were two primary differences between class of 1970 students and students of the later part of the decade. During my years as a student, the Vietnam War went from a war we were proud of to one that was falling apart. I would simply say that this was not a neutral experience or time. The war impacted our lives. We had difficult discussions with our World War II fathers, and we questioned our government in ways that were not done by the previous generation. The second difference was simply that there were no traditions when we came to Grace. When I returned, the school was well on its way to academic and athletic success. Dave Nigon had turned the football program around and the school won its first state championship. It was a more exciting environment but not as experimental.



GREG BARNIER

There were two experiences that drew me to know different people than I'd known in grade school. The first was being involved in the fledgling theater program. Involvement in that was something far different than grade school activities, and I met new people and gained a change in perspective as a result. The second was a sort of "mission" or service trip, two of which were organized by Sister Pat Frost. The trips were to the Fort Berthold Reservation in far western North Dakota. The first was at the end of our junior year and maybe 15 students or so participated. It was an exposure to an entirely new culture and way of life, and to some degree, that trip remained an influence for more than 10 years. It not only influenced me but also my younger brother.

Continuing with what I learned from two trips to the reservation with Sister Pat, the activities weren't described as "Lasallian" tradition back then. In hindsight though, that was clearly a good part of her purpose in undertaking to give that experience to us. It must have been a huge effort on her part but that is simply an example of the effort which all teachers gave to encourage their students. And that is the core similarity which I see at TG even today, nearly a half a century later.



DIANE KOZLAK

Mrs. Millie Rajacich taught history which was never my favorite subject. But Millie brought history to life as she assigned each of us a project to research a woman in history and report on their stories. Her enthusiasm for these women and the contribution they made to our collective history empowered us to think about the mark we wanted to make on the world. She helped us know that everything is possible!

I would also call out the impact the School Sisters of Notre Dame had on all of us but especially the female students. They were a living example of strength, wisdom, compassion, and the loving inclusion of all of God's children. To me they brought forward the feminine face of God into our Catholic education. They exemplified leadership and many of my female classmates went on to become leaders in their chosen fields under this example.

The first few years at Grace were an exciting time as our teachers worked together to create a new school community. I think the new school attracted teachers with the "start-up" mode spirit and a passion for making a difference. The excitement of starting something new was felt throughout the school. Students were empowered to build the culture as well. I worked with students to create the first Danceline Club, as an example. The small size of the school's population allowed everyone to participate at their preferred level of engagement.

SPORTS AND ACTIVITIES

Eagle athletic teams in 1970 included football, boys basketball, cheerleading, wrestling, boys track and field, baseball, boys golf, dance team, and cheerleading.

Co-curricular activities provided opportunities outside the classroom for students to discover and pursue a variety of interests. Language clubs, mission club, rock band, student council, art club, science club, pep club, yearbook, newspaper, and drama club were just a few of many options available at Grace High School.

Students enjoyed community events like Fall Festival, Sadie Hawkins, Junior Senior Prom, and Sno-Daze.

GRADUATION

The first class of Eagles graduated on May 27, 1970 in the school gym. The ceremony included an introduction by Mr. Pat Heiges of the Parent Association and remarks from

Senior Class President Greg Barnier and commencement speaker Brother Philip Lynch. Superintendent Br. William Koutsky and Principal Sr. Mary Tachney presented diplomas.

FACULTY AND STAFF

From the beginning, the Brothers and Sisters welcomed the presence of lay teachers and staff as their colleagues in every area of school operations. This partnership provided a continuity of spirit and tradition that endures as one of the school's hallmarks.

THE CHRISTIAN BROTHERS





Reflections from Greg Balego

Former Teacher, Coach, and Administrator



Greg Balego began his tenure at Grace High School in 1969. He served our community as a science teacher, helped start the Admissions Department in the '70s, and took on a leadership role in the Development Office in 1985. He coached softball and volleyball and is the parent of two graduates, Jesse '00 and Courtney '02. Although Greg publicly retired from his position as Vice President for Advancement in 2015, he has continued to support the department in a variety of ways. Greg shares a few thoughts on life at Grace in 1970.

The academic experience was very different. There was not much chance to accelerate or to slow things down. Students had some choices but they were limited. Popular electives were home economics, especially cooking; Spanish, German, and French languages; and business, especially typing. There was little technology in '70. Our first computer was a kit built by our physics teacher, Frank Preese, in '71.

Athletics were all about the boys. We had cross country and basketball for girls. There was no hockey at all, no soccer, no lacrosse. We played against other Catholic high schools but the school had no reputation; no one knew of us and no one cared. We weren't yet good enough to create a concern. Grace was still building momentum for what later became one of the most successful co-curricular programs in the state.

Mass was offered once a week and prayer services took place daily. With the presence of so many Brothers and Sisters and their dedicated mission, students were constantly reminded that Grace was a Catholic community.

In 1970, about 70 percent of graduates went on to two-year or four-year colleges. For many, they were the first in their family to do so. The class of 1970 was very concerned about the Vietnam War and they were at the beginning of the move to care about our environment. My science students wanted to get involved in the ecology movement so we spent two weeks in the spring of 1970 cleaning up the swamp behind the Brothers' Residence. We also started a recycling campaign – innovative at the time – sorting mixed glass so it would be collected and not sent to landfills.

The Brothers and Sisters made up half of the faculty. They were always present and always an influence. They taught the lay staff to give completely to their vocation. In 1970, the average age of the faculty was 23 years old — that included Louie Mitteco who was 39 and we all thought of him as an old man. The faculty respected the mission, liked one another, and loved the students. The early classes of teachers and staff set the tone for decades of educators to come.



As co-chair of the 2019-20 Totino-Grace Board of Directors, welcome to a new school year! I'm a parent of three alums ('06, lucky '13 and '15) and, together with the other 19 Board members, strive to help our faculty and staff foster the special environment and culture that TG provides all students who walk through our doors.

The Board has spent the last few years building on the school's 50+ year history of developing young adults. We improved our financial footing and purchased our land. All around us we see the benefits of investing in the well-rounded education at Totino-Grace. Our goal of being a strong Catholic institution that offers a rigorous curriculum in the Lasallian tradition — with a roster of co-curriculars unusual for a school of our size — has driven numerous initiatives at TG.

For example, our mission program has expanded dramatically in recent years. In 2018-2019, 140 students participated in 14 mission trips to destinations from Anniston, Alabama, to Haiti... TG's innovative Experiential Engineering Education program outgrew its space, so a new area has been retrofitted to meet the mounting interest in this curriculum... And we have augmented our commitment to need-based financial aid with academic scholarships — making a TG education available to more students.

So what is next for Totino-Grace? What changes should we implement to continue to advance our mission? We plan to assess our needs and plot our course for the next five years through a strategic planning process we are kicking off this fall and rolling out in 2020. As the plan takes shape, we will update you on how we expect to further strengthen our school to address the 21st century learning requirements of our student population. This is exciting work! 
We kicked off our fall season with the New Parent BBQ where we welcomed more than 100 new families to our community. 
