WHAT IS SPEECH?

Speech is a competitive activity that fosters learning the art of public speaking, but this activity encompasses so much more than just speaking. It involves analysis, performance, research, writing, leadership, creativity, listening, and more. Although competitive, this activity is also about personal growth and achievement. Each team member chooses or creates one speech piece to perform and perfect throughout the season. There are 13 categories in which students may compete:

- 2. Discussion
- 3. Duo Interpretation
- 4. Extemporaneous Reading
- 5. Extemporaneous Speaking
- 6. Great Speeches
- 7. Humorous Interpretation

- 8. Informative Speaking
- 9. Original Oratory
- 10. Serious Drama
- 11. Serious Poetry
- 12. Serious Prose
- 13. Storytelling

Practice begins in December. We schedule 6 Meets on Saturdays from late January through Mid-March. Team members are expected to attend at least 4 Meets. Schedule of Meets will be posted in December.
